

Dear LBC Family,

We are excited to be able to share these guidelines with you for this weekend's worship service. We have been prayerfully assessing all of the regulations and guidelines from the legal authorities on how to best proceed. We believe that we are able to meet these marks and are seeking to go above and beyond to keep everyone as safe as possible. We understand that some may feel that it is best for their family to not attend in person services, that is understandable, we hope you make it a point to join in on the Facebook Live Stream. This service will be a family service and we will do our best to keep it to 60 minutes.

Below you will find guidelines and important information for services during Phase 1 of the Governor's orders.

- Other than our Sunday 10:30am service the building will remain closed.
- The Commons, Sanctuary, Seniors Room, and Fellowship Hall will be the only areas open on Sunday morning. All other areas of the building will be closed.
- Bathrooms are available for the areas listed above, but we encourage you to use them only if it's an emergency.
- There will be no nursery or children's ministries during the service. We ask that parents always keep their children with them, including in the Sanctuary, Commons, Fellowship Hall, hallways, bathrooms, and parking lot.
- We will not distribute any paper bulletins or sermon handouts to limit spreading of germs.
- We will not take an offering during the service. We encourage you to give as you have been recently or using the offering box in the Commons on your way in or out.
- We will prop open doors for you to use to enter and exit the building. The glass double doors at the Common's and Fellowship Hall entrances will be the only ones used. All other exterior doors will be locked.
- No greeters will stand in doorways and all volunteers and LBC staff will maintain a six-foot social distance from others in the assembly. We ask that you maintain this distancing as well both inside the building and in the parking lot. While it's our natural impulse to greet one another with handshakes and appropriate gestures of kindness, we ask you to avoid physical contact with others at this time.
- The governor's guidance for churches recommends that attendees wear face coverings over their nose and mouth at all times. We encourage you to follow the governor's guidance regarding masks.
- Hand sanitizer is available in the Commons for when you enter and exit the building.
- Seating in the Sanctuary is restricted to facilitate 6-foot social distancing in compliance with the governor's restrictions. You can help us out by emailing ethan@lexva.church to let us know you are attending and how many of your family will be with you.
- We will dismiss you after the service section-by-section and ask that you make your way out of the church facilities through the open glass doors.
- The governor restricts people who have recently experienced or are currently experiencing sickness from attending. Please check out this <u>Symptom Chart</u>.
